Scholarship Criteria

COURSES:

You can enter the program as a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior, or Senior pursuing Graduate School

Basic Course – an elective course, an orientation to the military. Learn customs, courtesies, uniforms, history, etc.

It is **NON-BINDING**, meaning if you do not think the military is not for you, you can opt out of the program.

Advanced Course – More intensive training to prepare cadets for future duties as a senior cadet to ultimately serve as a second lieutenant on active duty in the US Army or part-time in the Army Reserves.

Scholarships:

- Pays Full tuition and Fees!
- ROTC Allowance (Tax free spending \$420 monthly)
- \$6000 per year Room & Board waiver
- \$1200 per year Book Money
- Guaranteed job upon graduation (pay. \$50K per year plus benefits)
- Worldwide Travel and adventures

Requirements: US Citizen, Pass Army Physical Fitness Test, pass a Department of Defense medical exam, No civil convictions, Minimum 2.5 GPA, Age requirement (17-28yr)

Educational Delay: to attend Law School, Medical or Dental School

ARMY ROTC FOUR-YEAR SCHOLARSHIPS

Focus on your Studies, Not how you'll Pay For Them!!

The high school Four-Year Scholarship is for high school students planning on attending a four-year college program. Contact your high school academic advisor or campus Military Science department for more information.

Requirements:

- Be a U.S. citizen
- Be between the ages of 17 and 26
- Have a high school GPA of at least 2.50
- Have a high school diploma or equivalent
- . Score a minimum of 1000 on the SAT (math/verbal) or 19 composite score on the ACT
- · Meet Physical and Medical standards
- · Agree to accept a commission and serve in the Army on Active Duty, Reserve Component, or National Guard

Scholarships:

- Full tuition and fees! Or Room and Board (\$6,000 per semester paid directly to cadet)
- ROTC Monthly Allowance (TAX FREE SPENDING MONEY!!) \$420 per month
- \$1200 per yearbook money!
- Potential University Incentives Free Room and Board
- Guaranteed job upon graduation approximately \$44,000 per year (not including all benefits)
- · Worldwide travel and adventures
- Interesting work not the typical 9-5 job!

Commitment:

- . A four-year service commitment in the Army, and four years in the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR)
- A six-year service commitment in the US Army Reserves or Army National Guard, and two years in the (IRR).


Important Dates:

Applications opened on June 12, 2023. Your application must be started no later than Feb. 26, 2024 to be eligible for review by the Army ROTC National Scholarship Board. Here are the application and board review dates for the 2023-2024 school year:

- Applications are due by Oct. 14, 2024 to be reviewed by the board from Oct. 21-25, 2024
- Applications are due by Jan. 20, 2025 to be reviewed by the board from Jan. 27-31, 2025
- · Applications are due by Mar. 17, 2024 to be reviewed by the board from Mar. 24-28, 2025

Apply Online For a National-Wide Army ROTC Four-Year Scholarship

If you are applying for a scholarship, you first will need to create a MY GOARMY account. Once you create an account, you will be sent to the MY GOARMY Log In page. Once you can successfully login to MY GOARMY, you can use your newly created account information to login to the scholarship application site.

National Board For High School Seniors, School Year 2024-2025

The Army is looking for the Scholar, Athlete, Leader (i.e. well-rounded student)

Scholarship Process:

- The online application opens 12 June (between junior and senior year of high school). Please Note: 2024-2025 Application
 Deadline to <u>begin</u> the online applications is 4 March of your senior year, and <u>document/file completion deadline</u> is 17

 March. <u>But</u>, boards meet in October, January, and March, so don't wait until the last minute!

 - A. Create an account/ Log In
 - 2. Upon creating an account, login to the scholarship application at: hs.usarmyrotc.com/my.policy
- Submit HS Transcripts, SAT/ACT, do an interview and physical fitness assessment
- Minimum High School GPA 2.5 to apply

Scholarship Benefits

- Full Tuition & Fees (In or Out of State rates!) OR Room and Board \$,600.00 per semester (not both)
- · \$420 Monthly Stipend during the school year.
- \$1200 per year for Books
- Free Army Uniforms & Training Equipment
- If attending a Senior Military College, you will receive a stipend for Corps uniform fees (ALL Cadets in good standing, scholarship or non-scholarship)
- Engineer Majors can get up to an extra year of benefits if needed (requires additional service obligation equal to the period of the extension of benefits).

<u>Service Obligation</u> Upon graduation/commissioning, serve fulltime on Active Duty (for a minimum of four years) or part-time in the National Guard or US Army Reserves (one weekend per month for Drill Weekends, plus two weeks per year for Annual Training for a minimum of eight years).

Keep in Mind: If you do not receive a scholarship on the National Army ROTC Scholarship Board you can still compete for 3.5, 3, 2.5 or 2 year Army ROTC scholarships while in college!
